HOW YOU CAN HELP

There are many volunteer positions throughout the hospital and satellite clinics. Some examples of Volunteer Positions are:

Listeners– Spend time visiting and talking with inpatients.

Waiting Room Liaisons– Helping families waiting for loved ones to come out of surgery or in the Burn ICU.

Patient Transport– Provide wheelchair transportation for patients throughout the hospital.

Ambassadors- Welcome visitors, offer directions and escort customers to destinations within the facility.

Medical & Patient Library- Deliver books and magazines to inpatients and clinics. Or assist Medical Library staff with customer service and sorting of library materials.



Caremobile Driver- Drive slow moving golf carts to provide transportation for patients and visitors to and from the parking lots and hospital doors. This is especially helpful for our customers with mobility issues.

Information Desk Greeter- Greet Visitors, give directions and information both in person and on the phone.

Clerical and Administrative— There are a variety of clinics and departments throughout BAMC that need volunteers to help at the front desk welcoming and assisting patients as well as helping with behind the scenes administrative work.

Optical Fabrication– Assist with the counting, sorting and shipping of approximately 1,500 prescription glasses each day in support of over 100 DoD clinics.

Professional Volunteers— BAMC is fortunate to have the support of volunteer doctors, nurses, pharmacists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, MRI techs and other licensed care providers.
