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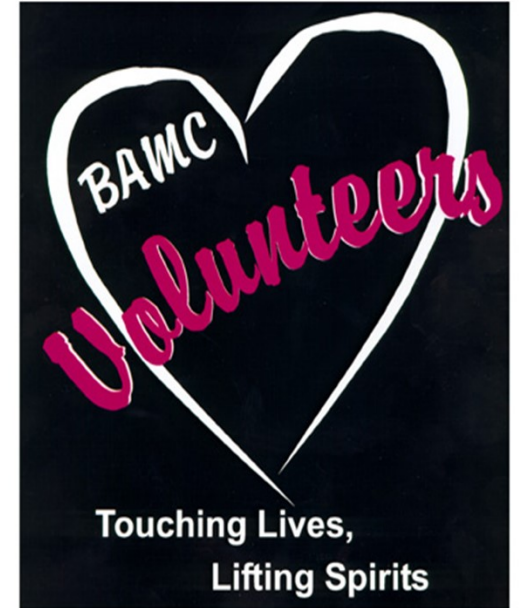

The BAMC Volunteer Program is selective and requires a one year commitment and an agreement to work at least one four-hour shift per week. Volunteers must be consistent and reliable.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

There are many volunteer positions throughout the hospital and satellite clinics. Some current openings are:

Listeners– Spend time visiting and talking with inpatients.

Waiting Room Liaisons– Helping families with loved ones in surgery or in the Burn ICU.

Patient Transport– Provide wheelchair transportation for patients throughout the hospital.

Information Desk Greeter– Greet visitors, give directions and help them feel comfortable in the large complex facility.

Ambassadors– Welcome visitors, offer directions and escort customers to destinations within the facility.

Patient Library– Deliver books and magazines to inpatients and clinics.



Tutor– Tutor Pediatric Oncology patients while they are in the hospital for their treatments. This is a great position for teachers and retired teachers.

Pharmacy Greeters– (Main and Moreno Clinic) Greet patrons, check eligibility, determine availability of prescriptions and issue ticket based on priority.

Specimen Transporter– Get your steps in transporting sealed and safe lab samples to the lab which will allow for faster turnaround for pediatric patients.

Clerical and Administrative– There are a variety of clinics and departments throughout BAMC that need volunteers to help at the front desk welcoming and assisting patients as well as helping with behind the scenes administrative work.

Professional Volunteers– BAMC is fortunate to have the support of volunteer doctors, nurses, pharmacists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, MRI techs and other licensed care providers.

Department of Ministry– The Department of Ministry and Pastoral Care has a variety of jobs for volunteers who value the spiritual influence in the healing process.

Fisher House–Volunteers work with families staying at the Fisher House while their loved one is recovering at BAMC. They help with cooking, decorating, special events and more.
